## Farm worker gets life term for murdering wife

The Mahila Court/ Additional Special Court for Exclusive Trial of Cases under Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act has awarded life imprisonment to a farm worker of Poorandampalayam in Coimbatore under Section 302 of IPC, for murdering his wife by inflicting multiple injuries. Dharmaraj was enraged and murdered his wife in an inebriated state as she did not respond to his phone call, according to the first information report. The body of Uma was found in the garden of Swaminathan by a neighbour Palanisamy on May 11, 2024. Based on the information provided by Swaminathan, the inspector of Sulthanpettai police station, registered a case and arrested the accused. Sessions judge V. Sundararaj also imposed ₹500 fine on Dharmaraj.

# Multi-sports turf to be built at Kumaraswamy Lake bund in Coimbatore

The lake is one of the nine waterbodies taken up for rejuvenation under the Smart Cities Mission; 'project is estimated to cost ₹60 lakh, and work expected to commence within two months'

he Coimbatore Corporation has drawn up plans to develop a multi-sports turf on the bund of Kumaraswamy Lake, locally known as Muthannankulam, near R.S. Puram. The lake is one of nine waterbodies taken up for rejuvenation by the civic body under the Smart Cities Mission.

During the rejuvenation project, the Corporation cleared encroachments that had been identified along the eastern and northern bunds and in portions of the water spread.

The clearance was carried out in a phased manner. Following this, the

storage capacity of the tank improved and the water spread area increased to 20,870 sq. m. Alongside these works, a walking track, children's play area, and other public amenities

were created along the bund of the lake for use by the local community.

According to the Corporation, the proposed turf is meant to provide a prepared surface for sporting activities. At present, the open space near the lake has only an earthen surface, which becomes difficult to use during rain or when uneven.

The facility will be laid with artificial grass and fitted with lighting, fencing, and green shade nets, making it suitable for games such as cricket and football, including during evening hours.

A senior Corporation official said the project is estimated to cost ₹60 lakh, and work is expected to commence within two months after the tender process.

The turf will come up on the bund along Pusaripalayam Road, where basketball and volleyball courts are already located.

## Training programme for newly-recruited work inspectors begins

Training for 366 newly-recruited work inspectors in Coimbatore district began on Saturday.

The recruits, appointed through direct recruitment by the Municipal Administration and Water Supply Department to monitor and oversee civic works in corporations, municipalities, and town panchayats, will undergo sessions until September 20 at the District Government Model School in R.S. Puram. The programme is being conducted by Anna University faculty along with department officials.

Minister for Municipal Administration K.N. Nehru inaugurated the induction training through video conference from Chennai. Appointment orders had

recently been issued to 2.538 people selected for various posts - including assistant engineer, assistant engineer (planning), junior engineer (planning), technical assistant, designer, work supervisor, work inspector, and sanitary inspector – in corporations and municipalities. Of these, 1,634 have since joined duty. As part of their induction, training sessions for different posts are being conducted at centres in Chennai, Salem, Coimbatore, Tiruchi, and Madurai.

A video screening of the inauguration was organised at the Corporation Kalaiarangam where District Collector Pavankumar G. Giriyappanavar, Coimbatore MP Ganapathi P. Rajkumar, and Corporation Commissioner M. Sivaguru Prabakaran participated.

## Residents seek protection from wild elephant

## Over 9.29 lakh cubic metres of legacy waste accumulated at Vellalore dumpyard: CPCB

The Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) has reported that 9,29,109 cubic metres of legacy waste remain piled up in three different areas within the Veldumpyard lalore Coimbatore.

It has directed the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board (TNPCB) to ensure that the Coimbatore Corporation complies with the Solid Waste Management (SWM) Rules, 2016.

The directive followed joint inspections by the CPCB and TNPCB in July this year. The inspections high-

lighted continued noncompliance at the site, where municipal solid waste has been dumped. In its directive, the

CPCB said that of the 1,100 tonnes of waste handled daily at Vellalore, only about 990 tonnes were processed and that the waste reaching the processing facility was found to be mixed waste. It added that the chicken and meat waste processing facility at the site was closed in February this year, after

Residents hoist black flags against Tiruppur Corpn.'s move to dump garbage in abandoned quarry

Residents of Mudalipalayam on the outskirts of Corporation hoisted black flags at their houses on Saturday to register their protest against the local body's move to dump garbage in an abandoned quarry in the village.

## On roadsides

The Corporation is confronted with the challenge of removing garbage piled up on the roadsides due to the unavailability of dumping spots, over the last month.

Close to 800 tonnes of garbage is generated every day in the city limits, and the accumulated waste has

triggered fears of epidemic outbreak among residents.

## **Pollution**

The complaint of the public in Mudalipalayam is that the civic body is dumping the wastes without proper segregation, thereby polluting land, water, and air. The residents, most of

them farmers, have put up the black flags to convey their fear of loss of livelihood due to the pollution. Black flags were seen fluttering atop houses, and also roadsides in the village.

The protesters were particularly piqued by the use of police personnel by the local body to silence them, and go about dumping the wastes in the quarry.
